\*\*\* RULES \*\*\*

1. Anyone is welcome to exhibit. On arrival, exhibitors please report to Show Committee for instructions. Exhibitors will be given a free pass.
2. All entries must be ready for judging by 11:00 AM, June 9. Doors open to exhibitors at 8:00 AM. Doors open to the public at 3:00 PM.
3. Containers, except for arrangements, will be supplied.
4. All entries will be placed finally by the Committee.
5. While due care will be taken of exhibits, the Show sponsors will not be responsible for loss or damage.
6. All exhibits are to be left intact until 6:00 PM Sunday, and removed as promptly thereafter as possible.
7. All flowers must be grown by exhibitors, except in the arrangement classes.
8. The decision of the judges will be final.
9. All varieties must be labeled correctly with name and variety, if possible.
10. Artificial material cannot be used in any way, shape, or form.
11. This is a ribbon show, entries being judged against perfection. Ribbons may be packed up Sunday 6:00 to 6:30 PM.
12. A sweepstakes ribbon rosette will be awarded in each Section.



SECTION A - IRIS

Class 1 - 1 Stem, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 2 - 6 Stems, 1 variety or mixed, 3 entry limit.

SECTION B - PEONIES

Class 3 - 1 Bloom, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 4 - 6 Blooms, 1 variety or mixed, 3 entry limit.

SECTION C - HYBRID TEA ROSES (Disbudded)

Class 5 - 1 Bloom, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 6 - 3 Blooms, 1 variety, limited to 3 entries.

SECTION D - FLORIBUNDA ROSES (Not Disbudded)

Class 7 - 1 Stem, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 8 - 3 Stems, 1 variety, limited to 3 entries.

SECTION E - GRANDIFLORA ROSES (Not Disbudded)

Class 9 - 1 Stem, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 10 - 3 Stems, 1 variety, limited to 3 entries.

SECTION F - MINIATURE ROSES (Not Disbudded)

Class 11 - 1 Stem, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 12 - 3 Stems, 1 variety, limited to 3 entries.

SECTION G - CLIMBING ROSES (Not Disbudded)

Class 13 - 1 Stem, limited to 3 entries of 1 variety.

Class 14 - 3 Stems, 1 variety, limited to 3 entries.

SECTION H - POTTED PLANTS

( Limited to 2 pots of a variety )

Class 15 - Flowering plants

Class 16 - Foliage plants

Class 17 - Orchids

SECTION I - AFRICAN VIOLETS - Single Plant Class

( Limited to 2 pots of a variety )

Class 18 - White

Class 19 - Lavender

Class 20 - Blue

Class 21 - Variegated, picotee, or spotted

SECTION J - AFRICAN VIOLETS - Multiple Plant Class

( Limited to 2 pots of a variety )

Class 22 - White

Class 23 - Lavender

Class 24 - Blue

Class 25 - Variegated, picotee, or spotted

SECTION K - ANNUALS and PERENNIALS

( Limited to 3 entries of a variety )

Class 26 - 3 Annuals, 1 variety

Class 27 - 3 Perennials (or Biennials), 1 variety

Class 28 - 3 Bulbous rooted cut flowers, 1 variety

SECTION L - ARRANGEMENTS

( Limited to 1 arrangement in each class.  
Exhibitors to supply their own containers.)

Class 29 - Traditional living room arrangement.

Class 30 - Contemporary living room arrangement.

Class 31 - Dining room table arrangement.

Class 32 - Artistic arrangement using only  
foliage of various kinds. Not to  
exceed 18" overall.

Class 33 - Miniature arrangement, not to  
exceed 5" overall.

Class 34 - Any arrangement by a man.

SECTION M - VEGETABLES

Class 35 - Lettuce - 1 head or neat bunch

Class 36 - Peas - 12 pods.

Class 37 - Any other vegetable.

NOTE: The Judges are privileged to give  
recognition to meritorious exhibits  
or arrangements in other than the  
established classes.



OBJECTIVES of the Men's Garden Club are:

1. To stimulate interest and increase knowledge among gardeners,
